

# HISTORICAL PLACES IN FARIDKOT



## Tilla Baba Sheikh Farid Ji



Once Baba Sheikh Farid, a great Sufi saint, was passing through Faridkot city (known as Mokalhar at earlier times). The soldiers of Raja Mokalsi captured Baba Farid and put him to bonded labour for the construction work of Qila Mubarak. Baba Farid carried a pitcher full of sand which was seen floating over his head. When Raja Mokalsi saw that miracle he fell at Baba Ji's feet and asked for forgiveness. Baba Ji pardoned Raja and did meditation for

40 Days at a place near the Fort where now Gurdwara Tilla Baba Farid ji is situated. The name of the City was changed to Faridkot from Mokalhar from that day. There are 134 hymns (Shabads) of Baba Farid Ji incorporated in sacred Gurbani.

#### **Faridkot Fort**

The Faridkot fort with its impressive architecture still adorns the city of Faridkot. Its foundation is believed to have been laid by Raja mokalsi, Raja Hamir Singh renovated it and got it expanded. Later ruler like Raja Bikram Singh. Raja Balbir singh edit many new buildings. Which housed the royal Place. Tosha Khana, Modi Khana & Treasury Buildings. There is a



garden within the four walls of the fort. All the buildings are very well built and well furnished.

## Raj Mahal



'Raj Mahal' (Royal Palace) was built during the reign of Maharaja Bikram Singh during 1885-1889 under supervision of the, then Crown Prince (Later Maharaja) Balbir Singh, who incidentally was the first to move in and start living in it. Spread over nearly 15 acres, it presented a magnificent look with French design, dominating grassy lawns a mid semi desert area of the State. Its entrance called "Raj Deori"- itself is a heritage building of a vintage and now houses Balbir Hospital.

#### Gurudwara Godari Sahib Ji

Gurudwara Godari Sahib is situated on the out skirts of Faridkot about 4 K.M. on Faridkot-Kotkapura road. It is believed that Baba Sheikh Farid ji left his godari (Jacket) there before entering Faridkot town. A beautiful gurdwara was constructed in 1982 and a Sant Sarover was later constructed at this place. Large numbers of people visit this place every Thursday and also take holy dip in this Sarover.
